# What is Al?

Al stands for Artificial Intelligence.

It means computer programs that can do things like:

- Answer questions
- ♣ Write stories or emails
- Give ideas for projects
- ♣ Talk or chat like a person

Some examples of AI tools include:

ChatGPT – Frammarly – Speech-to-text apps – A Learning games

# Why does MIAG use AI?

At MIAG, we use AI to:

- Help you learn in fun and creative ways
- Support you if reading or writing is tricky
- ♣ Give you ideas when you're stuck
- Make learning more interesting and accessible

But... we use it carefully and safely

# The Rules for Using AI at MIAG

#### 1. Be Safe

- Never put your full name, address, or personal info into an Al tool
- ♣ Only use AI when a staff member says it's OK

#### 2. Be Honest

♣ Don't use Al to do your work for you

You can get help, but the ideas should still be yours!

#### 3. Be Smart

Al isn't always right!

#### Check the answers and ask staff if you're not sure

#### 4. Be Respectful

- ♣ Never use AI to create or share anything rude, fake, or unkind
- ♣ If you're worried about something you've seen or made—tell an adult

# What AI can help you with:

- Getting ideas for writing
- Learning new words or facts
- Reading things aloud to you
- Helping with spelling and grammar

## What Al must NOT be used for:

- Copying full answers into your work
- Bullying or being mean
- Sharing personal information
- Pretending to be someone else

### How staff use Al:

- ♣ To make lesson plans
- To create fun activities or games
- ♣ To help with admin tasks

They don't use AI to judge or label learners

# What if I don't understand AI?

#### That's OK!

- ♣ You can ask any adult at MIAG
- We'll learn together!

#### Remember:

- Al is a tool but you are the learner.
- Your ideas, effort, and voice matter most.
  - Stay safe, be kind, and use it wisely.
