Policy Statement:

MIAG (Meeting Individual Aspirations & Goals) is committed to ensuring the health, safety, and welfare of all learners, staff, contractors, and visitors. We recognise that some substances used in our provision may pose risks to health if not properly managed. This policy outlines how MIAG will control exposure to hazardous substances in line with the Control of Substances Hazardous to Health Regulations 2002 (as amended).

Aims:

- To prevent or reduce staff, learners, and others being exposed to hazardous substances
- 4 To ensure all hazardous substances are used, stored, and disposed of safely
- ♣ To provide staff and learners with clear guidance and training on safe handling
- To comply fully with relevant health and safety legislation

Scope:

This policy applies to all staff, learners, contractors, and visitors who may come into contact with hazardous substances on MIAG premises. This includes (but is not limited to):

- Cleaning materials (e.g. bleach, disinfectants)
- Science or workshop materials
- Art, craft, or food technology substances (e.g. glues, paints, aerosols)
- Maintenance and site management chemicals

Responsibilities:

The Directors

- ♣ Ensure COSHH assessments are in place, reviewed annually, and adhered to
- Allocate adequate resources for safe storage and training

SLT and Designated Safeguarding & Health and Safety Lead

- Maintain an up-to-date COSHH register of all hazardous substances
- ♣ Ensure staff are trained in safe handling and risk reduction measures
- 4 Provide personal protective equipment (PPE) where required
- Investigate and report any COSHH-related incidents

Staff

- ♣ Follow all COSHH procedures and risk assessments
- Report any concerns, leaks, spills, or near misses immediately
- Ensure learners are supervised at all times when substances are in use

Learners

- ♣ Follow staff instructions regarding the safe use of materials
- Never handle hazardous substances unsupervised
- Report any spillages or unsafe practices to a staff member immediately

Procedures:

COSHH Assessments

- 4 All hazardous substances will be risk assessed before use
- Assessments will include: substance details, potential hazards, who may be at risk, and control measures
- 4 Assessments will be reviewed annually or sooner if products change

Storage

- Hazardous substances will be stored in clearly labelled containers
- Cleaning chemicals will be locked away and inaccessible to learners
- ♣ Flammable or high-risk materials will be kept in designated secure storage areas

Use

- Substances will only be used for their intended purpose
- Staff and learners will follow manufacturer's safety instructions at all times
- ♣ PPE (e.g. gloves, goggles, aprons) will be worn where identified in risk assessments

Disposal

- Substances will be disposed of safely in accordance with supplier instructions and environmental regulations
- Staff must never pour hazardous chemicals down sinks or drains unless specified safe to do so

Emergencies

- Spillage procedures will be displayed in relevant areas
- First aid arrangements are in place for exposure incidents
- Staff must report all accidents or near misses on the MIAG Accident/Incident Form

Training:

- 4 All staff handling hazardous substances will receive COSHH training
- Learners will be provided with age-appropriate guidance when using substances during lessons (e.g. cooking, art, science)

Monitoring and Review:

- 4 The Health and Safety Lead will carry out regular checks to ensure compliance
- ♣ The COSHH register will be updated whenever a new substance is introduced
- 4 This policy will be reviewed annually or following any significant incident
