What is this about?

This policy helps everyone at MIAG (Meeting Individual Aspirations & Goals) stay safe from fire. It tells you what to do if there is a fire and how we try to stop fires from happening.

Why is fire safety important?

Fires are dangerous. We want to make sure:

- You know what to do if there is a fire
- Staff help you stay safe
- The building has working alarms and clear exits
- We all practise what to do in an emergency

Who keeps you safe?

- The Proprietor is in charge of fire safety
- A fire safety officer checks the alarms, fire equipment, and exits
- All staff know what to do and will help you
- 4 You have a role too by listening and following instructions

What happens if there's a fire?

If you see fire or smoke:

- Tell an adult straight away
- ♣ The fire alarm will make a loud noise
- You must leave the building calmly
- Go to the fire assembly point outside
- Staff will check that everyone is safe

Fire Drills:

- 4 We practise fire drills each term so you know what to do
- You must follow staff instructions and walk quickly and safely
- ♣ These drills are not real fires, but they help you be prepared

Fire Equipment:

- MIAG has fire alarms, extinguishers and emergency lights
- Staff check and test the equipment regularly
- Fire exits are kept clear so we can get out safely

& Help for Learners with Extra Needs:

- If you need extra help to leave the building, we will make a Personal Plan for you
- A trusted adult will help you during a fire or fire drill

Visitors:

- 4 All visitors and workers are told what to do if there is a fire
- Staff will look after them and help them leave safely

What can YOU do?

- Listen when we talk about fire safety
- **↓** Follow instructions from staff
- ♣ Don't mess around with fire alarms or equipment
- Stay calm and go to the fire point if the alarm goes off
